

# **Next Meeting:**

November 21, 2019 Covenant Presbyterian Church 1831 Deyerle Road Roanoke, VA 24018 The One Hundred Twenty-first Meeting of the Presbytery of the Peaks was called to order by **Moderator Will Robinson** at the **Presbytery Office**, Lynchburg at 9:30 a.m. Refreshments, hospitality, an orientation of first time commissioners and visitors, and registration occurred prior to the start of the meeting.

Following a welcome by **Transitional General Presbyter Carl Utley**, a quorum was declared by the **Stated Clerk**, **John Weiderholt**. Ruling Elder **Helen Dean**, **Second Roanoke and**Teaching Elder **Elizabeth Link**, **Second Roanoke**, were appointed to serve as tellers and Teaching Elder, **Philip Bouknight**, **Trinity/SML** was appointed to offer a resolution of appreciation at the end of the assembly.

After consideration of the consent agenda, a revised consent agenda was approved. The presbytery was led in a Celtic Worship service by **Rev. Brent Williams, Colonial,** and **Rev. Janet Chisom, Salem** and Celtic musicians **Josh Kinn and Julie Borden**. The sermon was given by Candidate **Sara Jane Nixon, New Dublin.** The service also included a **Two Cents a Meal Offering of \$ 1,133.81.** 

**Ginny Fedison** and **Kym Wiederholt**, members of the Committee on Ministry, as well as **Mike Nyquist**, member of Mayberry Presbyterian Church, spoke on the role of liaisons in the presbytery.

Liaisons provide personal contact with churches who have questions, churches in transition with pastors, and beginning discernment. Both committee members spoke on the importance of this ministry in the presbytery. Mike Nyquist talked about his church's transition following the retirement of their pastor Stewart Childress and the help of the liaisons.

Order of the Day occasioned the Report of the Examinations Committee, Rev. Bob McLavey, Chair. The Presbytery examined and approved for ordination candidate Sara Jane Nixon. Sara Jane has received a call to the New Dublin Presbyterian Church.

The Presbytery also examined and approved the Rev. James (Jim) Moss who will be serving the McAllister Memorial Presbyterian Church.

**Sue Bentley**, chair of the COM, presented several Recommendations to the Presbytery. The Presbytery approved the terms of call and installation commissions for:

- 1. Sara Jane Nixon, called to New Dublin PC
- 2. Jim Moss, called to McAllister Memorial PC
- 3. Matthew Aldas, called to Buchanan PC

The Presbytery approved the COM report on the 2019 Terms of Call for installed pastors.

The **2020 Minimum Financial Terms of Call** was approved for first reading. This report has a 1.6% increase in the cash salary for installed pastors. The Board of Pensions percentage remains at 37% for the pastors participation plan.

**Sue Bentley** presented **Ruling Elder Pam Claterbaugh**, of Green Ridge PC, Roanoke, to be commissioned as Director of Congregational Ministries at Quaker Memorial Presbyterian Church, Dusty Fiedler, is her appointed mentor.

COM recommended and the presbytery approved the appointment of an Administrative Commission at the request of Green Ridge Presbyterian Church, Roanoke to assist with their assimilation into Northminster Presbyterian Church. The members of the Administrative Commission are: TE, Ed Soto, Moderator; TE, Morgan Whitfield; RE, Betsy Robinson, Green Ridge Presbyterian Church; RE, Lynn Kirby, Northminster Presbyterian Church; and RE, Tony Ward, West End Presbyterian Church.

The Presbytery celebrated the ministry of Teaching Elder, Russell Lee, First South Boston. Russell was granted honorable retirement effective November 1, 2019.

**Susan Verbrugge**, Chair of the Committee on Preparation for Ministry presented Rachel Sutphin who was approved to move from inquirer to candidate status under the care of Peaks Presbytery.

The Cabinet presented, and Presbytery approved the second reading and adoption of a new mission statement and priorities. The new Mission Statement is

"Building partnerships in Christ to empower communities of faith to be the Body of Christ for the world."

The three priorities are:

- 1) To strengthen every congregation, campus ministry, new worshipping community, community of faith, and leaders of all ages through communication, connections, and education.
- 2) To collaborate with every congregation, campus ministry, new worshipping community, and other communities of faith in developing effective and appropriate ministries for the 21<sup>st</sup> century
- 3) To embody all of the above priorities in designing a sustainable staffing model for the presbytery, in calling/hiring staff, and in locating the presbytery office.

The **Nominating Committee, moderator John Erb,** presented a slate of people to serve on the various committees of the presbytery.

The Presbytery approved for second reading and adoption the Mission Scholarship Application.

The Presbytery approved the recommendation of the Trustees for the transfer of .51 acres from the Mary Horner Walker PC to the Mary Horner Walker Cemetery Association.

Written reports were received by the **Presbyterian Women**, Committee on Administration, the Stated Clerk, and Session Records Workgroup.
