

February 13, 2020 Presbytery Meeting

The One Hundred and Twenty-third Meeting of the Presbytery of the Peaks was called to order by Stated Clerk, John Wiederholt at 9:30 a.m., on February 13, 2020 in the sanctuary of Forest Presbyterian Church, Forest, VA, at which time we installed the 2020 Moderator, Skip Martin, and 2020 vice-moderator, Steve Willis.

Following opening business and approval of the docket and consent agenda, the presbytery was led in worship in the spirit of Wild Goose Christian Community in Bonsack by their worship leaders Rev. Loren Tate-Mitchell and musician Lori Turner. The annual reading of the necrology and the quarterly Two Cents a Meal Offering were included. The offering was \$922.03.

Included in the consent agenda were the 2021 Presbytery meeting dates. Weather dates, if needed, will be two weeks after the scheduled date. 1) February 11, 2021 (Thursday) 2) May 1, 2021 (Saturday) 3) August 14, 2021 (Saturday) and 4) November 18, 2021 (Thursday)

The Cabinet recommended for a first reading a framework for a way forward for the presbytery, the culmination of two years of conversation and discernment led by the Mission Study Team. One amendment was approved that resulted in the expansion of a part-time communication director position to full time. Two amendments that sought to change the formation of three "commissions" in the place of three "committees" were defeated. After considerable debate the Mission Study Report was approved unanimously. (The approved document can be found on the presbytery's website.)

Cabinet also reported it had approved an increase of \$2.00 for the cost of lunch at Presbytery Meetings. Beginning with the Feb. 13 Presbytery Meeting, lunch will be \$8.00.

Following lunch, the Examinations Committee presented three candidates for transfer into our presbytery. Revs. Kelsey and Peter Hawisher-Faul to serve as Co-Pastors of The Presbyterian Church of Radford and Rev. Cheryl Peeples, to serve as Pastor of Forest Hills Presbyterian Church, Martinsville. They were approved and upon the recommendation of the Committee on Ministry, the presbytery approved the terms of call for each.

As a special celebration, Keith Leach, pastor of College Church, recognized Robert Hall for his 34 years at Hampden Sydney. The Presbytery offered its thanks for his many years of service and wishes him a wonderful retirement.

Richard Claterbaugh, chair of the Administration Committee, presented the committee's report. Actions reported included:

- Approved 2020 Housing allowance for Rachel Shepherd and Carl Utley.
- Approved the renewal of the Pastor Nominating Committee Instructor position and contract with Howard Jennings for a one year period beginning January 1, 2020.
- Approved the contract for Small Church Residency Administrator Betsy Soto for a one year period beginning January 1, 2020.
- Approved the extension of the Associate Presbyter for Discipleship for a six month period, at her request, beginning April 1, 2020 and ending on September 30, 2020. There will be a recognition of this ministry at the August 15, 2020 Presbytery meeting.
- Approved Mission Committee request for funding from the Mission Fund, pending adoption by the Committee of a plan to address the processes for 1) informing the entire Presbytery of funding availability and 2) mechanism for fund allocation.

The presbytery approved terms of call for transitional presbyters Carl Utley and Rachel Shepherd and the 2020 Budget as presented. The budget included \$10,000 for the General Presbyter Nominating Committee expenses.

Bob Fiedler, chair of the Missions Committee, thanked the congregations who participated in the Two Cents a Meal program for 2019. Giving to this program increased 2% in 2019.

Michael Nevergold, chair of the committee, presented two recommendations. Presbytery approved the following General Presbyter Search Committee.
