This Sohmer Parlor Grand Piano was made in New York in 1900. It has spent most of its life in Fincastle. We believe it was originally in the Slicer house on Roanoke Street as the home piano used by Herndon Slicer, a popular Roanoke radio personality of the 1930s. In 1950 it was acquired by Viola Wiek Painter, a lifelong FPC member and director of music for more than 30 years. When Viola died in 1981, the piano was passed to Monty Simmons Leitch, Viola's granddaughter, who took it to her home in Floyd County. In 2014, two years before Monty's death, she and her husband Marshall had it fully rebuilt and restored to its original condition by David West Piano in Roanoke.
