

### News of the World by Paulette Jiles

Early this year a movie was being shown at the Buchanan Theater that starred Tom Hanks. The movie title meant nothing to me nor could I remember it but if Hanks were the star, it must have merit. And indeed it did have merit. Hanks portrays Captain Kidd, a Confederate officer, who lost his printing business in the war. So In 1870 he packed his supply of newspapers and journals in a waterproof case, traveled about his native Texas reading to citizens who gathered in an auditorium he'd rented. They dropped a dime in the tin can at the door and listened to him read the news. As he was finishing his reading one evening, he spotted friends who signaled him they wanted to talk. These men worked a delivery service that took them all over the state. When they met in the stable, Captain Kidd was shocked to see a ten-year-old girl these men had brought from the Kiowa Tribe,

who had abducted her at age six after killing the other members of her family. But now the US Army was cracking down on such abductions and her relatives had to provide a fifty dollar gold piece to whomever would return her to her aunt and uncle in south Texas. The delivery men were not going in that direction, thus the request for the Captain to take on the task as he continued his travels from town to town reading the news. This began an adventure for this mix-matched pair facing dangerous men with evil intensions for the girl, dangerous weather, dangerous terrain and so much more. To add to the tension the girl only spoke Kiowa since she remembered nothing of her language from age six. The film is based on a novel of historical fiction published in 2016 by Paulette Jiles. When I learned this after seeing the film, I immediately requested the book on CD. Listening to the story with the vivid scenery from the film in my memory just enhanced the story all over again.

### Shrimp Casserole

1-1 1/2 lbs shrimp deveined

1 pkg. Mahatma yellow rice

1 can cream mushroom soup

1 can Rotel tomatoes

1 green pepper diced( I use red)

1 onion diced

1/2 C butter( I don't use a whole stick)

2 C shredded sharp cheddar cheese

Cook rice according to directions.

Sauté onion and green pepper in butter. Add shrimp and sauté till pink.

Spoon into greased casserole and top with cheddar

Bake 350 approximately 40 minutes.

Can use chicken instead of shrimp. If using chicken use diced celery instead of green pepper.




# Suzanne Moore Kale Memorial Scholarship Recipient
