

We Heard an Update from the Presbyterian Foundation:

We Formed an Administrative Commission (AC):

The Committee on Ministry recommended the formation of an AC for Glen Wilton Presbyterian Church, due to the fact that they have no active session.

New 2021 Budget:

The Committee on Administration submitted a final 2021 budget for the year, which was approved.

New Separation Ethics Guidelines:

The Committee on Ministry presented a second reading of ethical guidelines based in the Book of Order for pastors leaving churches. This policy was approved.

Two Congregations Declared Extinct:

The Administrative Commissions for Trinity Ridgeway and Holmes Memorial Presbyterian Churches requested that those congregations be declared extinct. These motions were granted.
