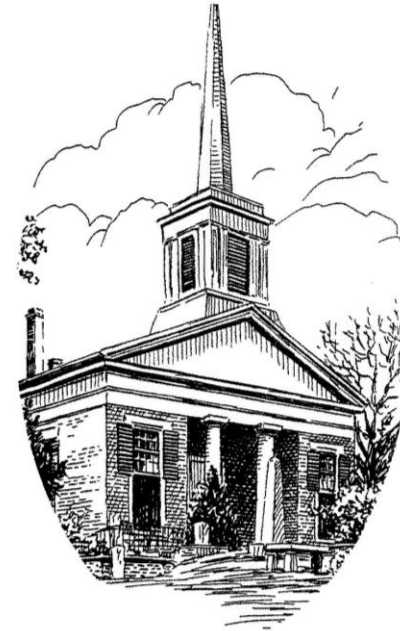
The Church Calendar
