## Habakkuk 1:1-4; 2:1-4

## Luke 19: 1-10

- 1 The oracle that the prophet Habakkuk saw.
- 2O Lord, how long shall I cry for help, and you will not listen? Or cry to you "Violence!" and you will not save?
- <u>3</u> Why do you make me see wrongdoing and look at trouble? Destruction and violence are before me; strife and contention arise.
