Now the Green Blade Riseth

As the handbell choir plays, take a moment to reflect on these words about the resurrection of Jesus, "Love is come again",

Christ is Risen, Indeed!

Now the green blade riseth from the buried grain, Wheat that in the dark earth many years has lain Love lives again, that with the dead has been: Love is come again, like wheat that springeth green.

In the grave they laid Him, Love who had been slain, Thinking that He never would awake again, Laid in the earth like grain that sleeps unseen: Love is come again, like wheat that springeth green.

Forth He sprang at Easter, like the risen grain, Jesus who for three days in the grave had lain; Quick from the dead my risen Lord is seen: Love is come again, like wheat that springeth green.



The Story behind: Now the Green Blade Riseth

John MacLeod Campbell Crum wrote this text to be paired with the popular French carol melody NOËL NOUVELET, sometimes referred to by the name FRENCH CAROL. During his life, Crum was highly active in the Church of England. While serving the church, Crum worked in a variety of theological areas and wrote on biblical and architectural topics, as well as studying historical works, writing children's books, translating hymns from Latin, to writing his own hymns.

This hymn first appeared in the 1928 edition of the *Oxford Book of Carols*. It was first printed in the United States in the 1966 edition of *The Methodist Hymnal*. This song shows Crum's ability to capture one's imagination, perhaps an extension of his children's writings. For those in the northern hemisphere who live in areas where springtime usually coincides with Easter, the image of growing plants and vegetation speaks clearly.

The natural imagery of this hymn provides insight into his writing style and the images of the natural world found in "Now the Green Blade Rseth." The vivid imagery of the hymn is based on John 12:23-24, 1 Corinthians 15:37-38 and John 3:16
