- Mark your calendar for 2¢ A Meal Sunday, coming up on May 7! What do you know about the origins of this Special Offering? The Two Cents-a-meal concept originated with Presbyterian women to provide an opportunity for individuals and families to participate in a corporate response to world hunger. In November 1975, Florida resident Rosellyn Calvert, whose own family was struggling financially, asked God what she could do to help those suffering from hunger and poverty around the world.

She was led to give just two cents a meal. The Calvert family committed to each give two cents, and in April of 1976 Rosellyn shared the concept with her presbytery. Today, most presbyteries encourage the contribution of two cents (or more) per person at each meal, reminding individuals, families and groups each time they eat of the needs of others and our call to respond as Christians to their hunger. Daily participation is a reminder of the reality of hunger for millions of our sisters and brothers in the world. \$.02 * 31 days = \$.62 per day per person in each family for one month.

The Story behind: The Solid Rock

1 Corinthians 3:11 "For no one can lay any foundation other than the one already laid, which is Jesus Christ."

Edward Mote knew nothing about God or the Bible as he grew up in London, England, the child of poor innkeepers. At the age of 16 he was genuinely converted to Christ. Mote later settled in a suburb of London where he became known as a successful cabinet maker and a devoted church layman.

After a time, a Baptist chapel was built in Horsham, Sussex, England, largely because of Edward's efforts. The grateful church members offered him the deed to the property. He refused it, saying, "I only want the pulpit, and when I cease to preach Christ, then turn me out of that." He ministered faithfully until forced to resign because of poor health one year before his death. He commented, "The truths I have been preaching, I am now living upon and they'll do very well to die upon."

During his busy life as a minister, Edward wrote more than 150 hymn texts. In 1836 he published a collection titled *Hymns of Praise* and included "The Solid Rock" in it.

William Batchelder Bradbury (1816–1868) was an American composer of gospel songs and hymns. He wrote the music for "The Solid Rock" along with other familiar hymns such as "He Leadeth Me", and "Jesus Loves Me."
