

Eternal Father, Strong to Save William Whiting/John B. Dykes

Little is known about the author of the words, William Whiting of London. He was Master of an Anglican school for musicians, and he wrote several hymns; but only this hymn is widely sung today. He wrote this hymn as a prayer for a friend who was preparing to sail to America.

The nautical references in the first verse share the thoughts that often accompanied those who were sailing in in the 1800's. It is called the "Navy Hymn" because of its association with the Naval Academy in Annapolis.

It was Franklin Roosevelt's favorite hymn and was sung at his funeral. In November of 1963, its solemn strains accompanied the casket of John F Kennedy as it was carried up the steps of the U.S. Capitol to lie in State.

The first verse is addressed to the Father, the second to Christ, the third to the Holy Spirit, and the last to the Trinity. These four verses combine to make it a natural choice for Trinity Sunday.

The deeply moving melody was written by the famous composer, John B. Dykes, who named the tune MELITA after the island where Paul was shipwrecked in Acts 27.

Other verses have been added to request travel mercies for those who travel in other forms, through the air, through space, coast guards, ship dedications, etc.

¹ In the beginning God created the heavens and the earth. ² The earth was without form and void, and darkness was upon the face of the deep; and the Spirit of God was moving over the face of the waters. ³ And God said, "Let there be light"; and there was light. ⁴ And God saw that the light was good; and God separated the light from the darkness. ⁵ God called the light Day, and the darkness he called Night. #2 Holy Holy, Holy

- 1 Holy, holy, holy! Lord God Almighty! Early in the morning our song shall rise to thee.
- Holy, holy! Merciful and mighty! God in three persons, blessed Trinity!
- 2 Holy, holy, holy! All the saints adore thee, casting down their golden crowns around the glassy sea; cherubim and seraphim falling down before thee, which wert, and art, and evermore shalt
- 3 Holy, holy, holy! Though the darkness hide thee, though the eye of sinful flesh thy glory may not see, only thou art holy; there is none beside thee, perfect in power, in love, and purity.
- 4 Holy, holy, holy! Lord God Almighty! All thy works shall praise thy Name, in earth, and sky, and sea; Holy, holy, holy! Merciful and mighty, God in three persons, blessed Trinity!*

#5 Come thou Almighty King

- 1 Come, thou Almighty King, help us thy name to sing, help us to praise: Father, all glorious, o'er all victorious, come and reign over us, Ancient of Days.
- 2 Come, thou Incarnate Word, gird on thy mighty sword, our prayer attend: come, and thy people bless, and give thy word success: Spirit of holiness, on us descend.
- 3 Come, Holy Comforter, thy sacred witness bear in this glad hour: thou who almighty art, now rule in every heart, and ne'er from us depart, Spirit of power.
- 4 To Thee, great One in Three, eternal praises be hence, evermore! Thy sovereign majesty may we in glory see, and to eternity love and adore!

#358 Eternal Father, Strong to Save

- 1 Eternal Father, strong to save, whose arm hath bound the restless wave, who bidd'st the mighty ocean deep its own appointed limits keep:

 O hear us when we cry to thee for those in peril on the sea.
- 2 O Christ, the Lord of hill and plain o'er which our traffic runs amain by mountain pass or valley low; wherever, Lord, thy children go, protect them by thy guarding hand from every peril on the land.
- 3 O Spirit, whom the Father sent to spread abroad the firmament; O wind of heaven, by thy might save all who dare the eagle's flight, and keep them by thy watchful care from every peril in the air.
- 4 O Trinity of love and power, thy children shield in danger's hour; from rock and tempest, fire and foe, protect them wheresoe'er they go; thus evermore shall rise to thee glad hymns of praise from land and sea.
