Leaning on the Everlasting Arms Elisha A. Hoffman

One day successful author, business man, and devout Presbyterian layman Anthony J. Showalter received letters from two different friends, telling him of their recent bereavements. He sat to try and write words of comfort to them, and used Deuteronomy 33:27— "The eternal God is your refuge, and underneath are the everlasting arms …"

As he finished writing his letters, it occurred to him that this verse would be a fine theme for a hymn, he jotted down the words and music for the refrain.

He felt though, that he needed assistance in writing the verses to go with this chorus, so he asked his friend, Elisha A. Hoffman, a pastor and author of many gospel songs, to furnish the verses. The hymn was then published in 1887 in the *Glad Evangel for Revival*, *Camp and Evangelistic Meetings Hymnal*.

Just As I Am Charlotte Elliott

Charlotte Elliott grew up in Brighton, England and was known as "carefree Charlotte." She was a popular portrait artist and a writer of humorous verse. At the age of 30, a serious ailment made her an invalid for life. She became listless and very depressed.

Her Brother, Rev. H. V. Elliott formulated a plan to found and fund a school to provide education of the daughters of clergyman, Others in her family planned bazaars and many things to help his project; she felt she couldn't do anything.

She was speaking with a visitor, a well-known Swiss evangelist, Dr. Caesar Malan, when he asked her if she knew herself to really be a Christian. She was irritated with him, and said that it was a matter she didn't want to discuss. He said he would not pursue the subject but would pray that she might give her heart to Christ, and employ in His service the talents with which God had gifted her. After several days of spiritual discernment, she came back and asked how she could possibly come to God with all of her physical and mental issues. He responded, "Why not come **just as you are**?"

She sat down and wrote for her own comfort the words of this song . She shared it with her sister-in-law. The words spread. When she assumed the editorship of *"Yearly Remembrancer"*, she inserted this hymn, with no author's name. It spread to other publications. Eventually she allowed her name to be added as author.
