"God Is Mindful of You and Me!"

"When I look at your heavens, the work of your fingers,
The moon and the stars that have established;
What are human beings that you are mindful of them,
Mortals that you care for them? ...
...O Lord, our Sovereign
How majestic is your name in all the earth! "
(Psalm 8:3,4 &9)

In this Psalm of David, the poet ponders the vast heavens that span the night sky above him. It is easy to imagine David, the poet-king, who had been, as a boy, a shepherd of sheep, standing under the desert sky at night and marveling at each and every planet, star and what we call the Milky Way. In the poem (Psalm 8) the poet then moves from his overwhelming wonder at the infinite vastness of God and God's Creation to the humbling awareness that, though we humans are so small by comparison, never-the-less, God is keenly and compassionately interested in us! Indeed, according to Psalm 8, we human beings are the crowning touch of God's earthly creation!

Perhaps, like David, we are tempted to think of ourselves as small, insignificant, not worth "saving". But according to the Bible's story you and I and all of humanity are the object of God's love and mercy, i.e. God's grace. This is the point made so lovingly in the whole of the Easter story! This is the point of John 3:16!

So, the next time you and/or I are tempted to think poorly of ourselves; or to wallow in our sins (in particular, our sin of self-pity!), remember: "God made me! And God don't make no junk!" (That quote is from a civil-rights poster of the early 1970's.) Or, as the psalmist wrote so beautifully: "Yet you have made them (human beings) a little lower than God, and crowned them with glory and honor." (Psalm 8:5)
