#### "But in fact Christ has been raised from the dead"

1 Cor. 15:20

First, Paul writes in his letter to the Corinthian church: "If Christ has not been raised, your faith is futile and you are still in your sins. Then those also who have died in Christ have perished. If for this life only we have hope in Christ, we are of all people most to be pitied." (1 Cor. 15:17-19) But then Paul declares the great Good News in 1 Cor. 15:20: "But in fact Christ has been raised from the dead, the first fruits of those who have died."

Easter comes during the springtime of the year, and coincides with the obvious signs of nature's reawakening following a long and cold winter's hibernation. Trees and shrubs are putting forth fragrant blooms and budding leaves. The wild life of forest and field are bringing forth a new generation of their new born. All of this is nature's response to our sun moving ever higher in the sky and warming our good earth.

So powerful are the signs of spring that some have thought the church's celebration of Easter is nothing more than a celebration of spring time and the renewal of life that comes in the spring of the year.

For the church, Easter is the bold claim by the church that on that first Easter morning God raised Jesus from the dead into the life eternal. This miracle we call the Resurrection. Because of the Resurrection Jesus' tomb was empty. Because of the Resurrection, the risen Christ could meet with His amazed disciples; could eat with them; and did commission them to build up His church by taking the Good News of His Resurrection throughout the world. "Making disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything that I have commanded you." (Mt. 28: 19-20)

Spring time is a wonderful time of year and should be received as a gift from God as a time of rebirth, renewed life, a celebration of life in all of its vitalities. But Easter is something more, infinitely more: it is the Good News that in Jesus Christ God has defeated both sin and death, and through our faith in Him, will give us the gift of life eternal.

By God's grace may we believe in Christ's Resurrection; and may we live the new life of grateful obedience that God offers us in the Good News of Easter! AMEN Happy Easter, David


Through One Great Hour of Sharing, we extend God's love to the most vulnerable. Please consider giving generously because when we all do a little, it adds up to a lot.


